

Education Services at The Anicca Program provided by Eastern Carver County Schools

Guide for Parents and Families

Eastern Carver County Schools provides regular and special education services to students enrolled and attending The Anicca Program for mental health day treatment. This flyer outlines roles, responsibilities, and the educational services provided in this care and treatment program.

Educational Roles & Responsibilities:

“Resident district” is your child’s school district in which his or her legal guardian/parent resides.

“Providing district” is the school district which actually provides education services and the district in which the care and treatment facility is located. In this case, Eastern Carver County Schools (ISD #112).

Frequently Asked Questions:

WHO PROVIDES TRANSPORTATION?

Your child’s resident school district is responsible for providing transportation to registered care and treatment programs. Please contact them to make arrangements.

WHEN DOES EDUCATION BEGIN?

Eastern Carver County Schools will begin to provide instruction immediately after the student is enrolled in The Anicca Program and Eastern Carver County Schools.

HOW LONG IS THE EDUCATIONAL BLOCK?

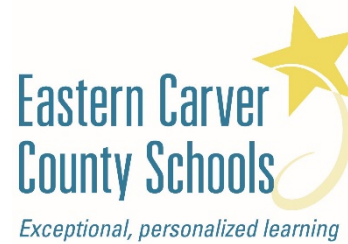
Your child will receive 3.5 hours of education each day he or she is enrolled and attending The Anicca Program. The schedule follows Eastern Carver County’s school calendar.

WHAT IS TAUGHT?

Instruction will focus on the core content areas of English/Language Arts, Science, Mathematics and Social Studies utilizing evidence-based curriculum aligned with Minnesota State Standards.

DO SCHOOL DISTRICT STAFF SEE MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT PLANS?

There is a clear boundary between the roles/responsibilities of Carver County employees and Eastern Carver County School employees. No confidential mental health student information is shared with educational staff without a release of information.



Enrollment Process

1. Carver County staff arrange tour/intake, intake is determined by Carver county therapy staff. Upon intake, Student is enrolled in The Anicca Program Eastern Carver County Schools. Education staff are not typically involved in this process.
2. Carver County staff shares student name, grade, and parent/guardian information with education team.
3. Eastern Carver County Schools will contact parents/guardian to review process and collect additional school specific enrollment and background information.
4. Eastern Carver County Schools will contact resident school district within one day to notify them of education enrollment, request verbal agreement to provide education services, and request education records.
5. During this phone call, verification regarding special education services will also occur (when appropriate). If the student receives special education services, the resident district will send most current IEP and evaluation and verbally review IEP goals and objectives as well as services provided.
6. The resident district provides education records via fax within two days.
7. School district enrollment is completed by Eastern Carver County Schools with assistance of parent/guardian and The Anicca Program, Carver County intake staff.
8. If the student is on an IEP, Eastern Carver County Schools will contact parents and reach an agreement about continuation or modification of special education services. Copies of documents will be provided to parents.
9. A written acknowledgment of services is sent to the resident school district for verification.
10. When exiting The Anicca Program, an education exit summary is completed and provided to parents/guardians and the resident school district.

Education Services - Guide for Parents, continued

Curriculum

Eastern Carver County Schools will be providing your child with his/her education while he/she is attending The Anicca Program. Each child will be provided with a total of 3.5 hours of education instruction each day while he/she is in attendance. This instruction will be provided by a dual-licensed general education / special education teacher. Standards-based curriculum will be implemented in the classroom to allow students to continue with their studies at their instructional level. Data collection and progress monitoring will occur throughout the time that your child attends The Anicca Program to document his/her progress, completion of work, and growth. The focus of Eastern Carver County Schools is on personalized learning, therefore the educational experience provided to your child will be specific to his/her needs and abilities.

Eastern Carver County Schools will also be providing specialized services to those children who have qualified and have an active Individualized Education Plan (IEP) for special education services.

The Family Education and Privacy Rights Act provide that educational records are available to parents of a student

The data requested on the Eastern Carver County Schools registration form will be maintained as part of your child's educational and directory records. Some data is required (such as name, address, and birthdates). Other information requested is not required (such as emergency contacts) but will help us to serve you and your child more efficiently. The information you provide may be shared with other staff within the school district and the Minnesota Department of Education, whose jobs require access, or other agencies as provided by law. Student educational records are considered private under Minnesota's Data Practices Act. Student directory information is designated per the School District's Data Privacy Policy.



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
